**REPORT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL SUB-COMMITTEE MEETING HELD
ON THURSDAY, 25TH SEPTEMBER, 2025 AT THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE
HALL, NYINAHIN**

The Environmental Sub-Committee met on Thursday, 25th September, 2025, at the District Conference Hall, Nyinahin, and discussed various environmental issues. After thorough deliberations, the committee made the following recommendations for consideration by the Executive Committee of the Assembly:

Observation of National Sanitation Day

The committee discussed the nationwide declaration of National Sanitation Day and recommended that the exercise should be observed in all electoral areas by the Assembly Members in collaboration with Unit Committee and traditional authorities within the district, since cleanliness is next to godliness.

Provision of Sanitation Equipment

The committee suggested that the Assembly should provide each electoral area with the necessary sanitation tools and equipment such as dustbins and brooms to facilitate the effective celebration of the next National Sanitation Day.

Commissioning of New Toilet Facility at Nyinahin Nkwanta

The committee observed that a new toilet facility had been completed at Nyinahin Nkwanta and recommended that it should be commissioned as soon as possible. The old toilet facility was in a deplorable condition and leaking, additionally it was observed that the toilet facility at the local basic school also requires urgent renovation to prevent sanitation diseases among pupil.

Lack of Toilet Facilities in Schools

The Committee expressed grave concern that several schools in the district do not have toilet facilities, compelling pupils to resort to open defecation. This situation poses significant health risks and undermines the sanitation standards of the district. It was strongly recommended that the Assembly should prioritize the construction of toilet facilities basic schools lacking such infrastructure.

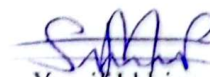
Promotion of Self-Help Projects

The committee discussed the importance of self-help initiatives and recommended that Assembly Members should be encouraged to initiate such projects within their electoral areas. The Assembly should also consider providing support, such as roofing sheets, to assist communities in constructing toilet facilities and other sanitation-related infrastructure.

After thorough deliberations, the Environmental Sub-Committee respectfully submits the above recommendations to the Executive Committee for further consideration and approval.
